Scaling Back the Wild by Connie Kratzke

By the time you read this, I will be far away. Far enough at least, for I am going on vacation! Almost every year, my husband and I spend the week of our anniversary camping somewhere in Minnesota. We spend the vast majority of our time in state parks because we like being able to hike and kayak without driving anywhere. Don't get me wrong- we head into town almost daily for beers and burgers. We just like to fully embrace where we're at once we get there. Being surrounded by beauty and inhaling crisp air are more than enough.

This year, we're heading away from what we're typically drawn towards to explore Lake Shetek in the south-west portion of the state. We have been to Blue Mounds where we found wild roses and prickly pears scattered amongst granite outcroppings. That is the only other southwestern park we've toured. Lake Shetek is a glacial lake, surrounded by prairies and forests. The contrast between the two parks is quite dramatic.

At one point our goal was to camp in all of the parks before revisiting any. Then we found ourselves frequenting Scenic and Savanna Portage. Both parks are enormous with a plethora of trails seamlessly transitioning woodlands, bogs and meadows. Glendalough is lovely with its pristine lakes, dark forests and flowing prairies. Lake Carlos has lovely pines and lakes, along with a fascinating history. Banning is an awesome place to hike with its river and rock. Cascade, Tettegouche and Split Rock Lighthouse are all amazing! I don't have

to say much about those parks because you've probably been there. Beaver Creek Valley was an extremely pleasant surprise with its aqua pools full of trout amidst a creek full of cress. I could go on. Our parks are why I love Minnesota. It's no wonder so many homeowners are looking to duplicate that "Up North" feel within their postage stamp.

Today I thought about some of my favorite, compact, native cultivars. 'Tiny Tortuga' Chelone, 'Little Goldstar' Rudbeckia (Rudbeckia fulgida 'Little Goldstar' PP22,397) and 'Little Joe' Eupatorium (Eupatorium dubium 'Little Joe' PP15,798) are three that come to mind. 'Standing Ovation' Little Bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparium 'Standing Ovation' PP25,202) makes a phenomenal backdrop for just about everything. 'Pixie Meadowbrite' (Echinacea 'CBG Cone 2' PP18546) is just a weird little Echinacea, but I love it completely. 'Huron®' Gray Dogwood (Cornus racemosa 'Hurzam') is a really great plant for tough, shady, understory areas. There are more, but I'm too tired to Google all of their legal names. 'Kobold' Liatris doesn't have a number and it's a great, compact, native cultivar.

Some native plants are naturally compact and tidy, blending well into suburban life. Geum triflorum can be used very effectively in beds and borders. When in bloom, its wisps of pink smoke drift in the breeze, creating a campfire ambiance. Wintergreen (Gaultheria procumbens) is a nice little groundcover for cool, shady areas. Canadian Ginger (Asarum canadense) is, too. I just planted Wild Petunia (Ruellia humilis) in my pollinator garden this summer and its heat and drought tolerance are commendable. Strong blooming and compact growing, I am totally willing to pretend it's a Minnesota native, despite its Packer roots. Nannyberry Viburnum in tree form works very well in urban landscapes. In shrub form, it makes a great Buckthorn replacement. White Snowberry is another one that is neat enough to maintain as a hedge, but native enough to help folks feel connected.

There are some non-native plants that make excellent imposters. 'Tannenbaum' Mugo Pine is one of my favorites. Can't fit a Red Pine into your backyard? Give it a whirl! Weave some 'Red Gnome™' Dogwoods (Comus alba 'Regnzam') around it and call it a day! No, wait! Put a 'Parkland Pillar®' (Betula platyphylla 'Jefpark' PP25,468) or 'Dakota Pinnacle®' Birch (Betula platyphylla 'Fargo' PP10,963) in the mix! Do whatever you want. I am going to bed so I can survive my last day of work before embarking on my next, inspiring quest for knowledge and nature.
